

## DATING THE REFORMATION




Historians usually date the start of the Protestand Years 1517-2017 estant Reformation to the 1517 publication of Martin Luther's "95 Theses." Its ending can be placed anywhere from the 1555

Peace of Augsburg, which allowed for the coexistence of Catholicism and Lutheranism in Germany, to the 1648 Treaty of Westphalia, which ended the Thirty Years' War. The key ideas of the Reformation—a call to purify the church and a belief that the Bible, not tradition, should be the sole source of spiritual authority—were not themselves novel. However, Luther and the other reformers became the first to skillfully use the power of the printing press to give their ideas a wide audience. (History Channel)

MARTIN LUTHER: Son of a miner, born November 10, 1483 in Eisleben in Thueringen. Taken by his parents to Mansfield where he began his schooling in the Latin school when 4 or 5 years old. Spent a year in Magdelburg and then (1497-1501—continued studies in Eisenach where he graduated in 1501.

Luther entered the University of Erfurt April 150l. He studied the liberal arts for four years and received a Master's Degree in January



Luther had acquired a good stock of Bible verses, Latin hymns, and Bible histories but he only learned to know Christ as the Judge and not as the Redeemer; as the Judge who would finally return and require of us a strict accounting of all we had done, said, or thought. He knew God as a stern, uncompromising and punishing God of Righteousness who would finally award to every man just what he had earned.

Luther was going to pursue a study of law as his father wished, but after being almost struck by lightening he vowed he would become a monk if he was spared. The belief of the day was that it was possible to live a holier life in the cloister than out of it and thus gain favor of the Judge.



# Accepting donations January 9th - February 5th


United Ministries' goal is to collect 5,100 pounds of food during this period in order to feed those who may not have any soup to fill their bowls this year.



#### New Business

 Discussion and vote on three resolutions to amend the constitution of The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod

#### Resolution 1

Resolution 11-09, "To allow Voting Privilege for Assistant Pastors," received two-thirds vote during Session 8 of the 2016 convention [Yes: 921; No: 58]. It amends
 Article V B and Article Xii 10 B by removing "assistant pastors" from the two lists of "advisory members [only]."

#### Resolution 2

 Resolution 11-18, "To Clarify and Confirm the Distinction between Synod and Corporate Synod and to Provide Consistency doe the Meaning of Property of the Synod Regarding Article IV Powers," received the required two-thirds vote during session 8 if the 2016 conventions being adopted without any opposing votes. It amends Article IV by inserting, after "Synod," the words "in convention is empowered to and has formed corporate entities which."

#### Resolution 3

- Resolution 11-19, "To Clarify and Confirm the Distinction between Synod and Corporate Synod and to Provide Consistency for the Meaning of 'Property of the Synod' Regarding Article XI." Received the required two-thirds vote during Session 8 of the 2016 convention [Yes: 903; No: 66]. It amends Article XI E 2 to replace instances of "Synod" with "The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod" and to clarify that "for purposes of this article, The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod includes both the Synod formed by Constitution and the Missouri corporation formed by the Synod."
- Motion to accept the above three (3) Resolutions by Allen Summers and seconded by Al
   Weirmeir. Approved
- Habitat for Humanity 2017 update Keith Jones
  - Discussion of how the congregation may be involved with Habitat for Humanity by volunteers or by contribution and should we have Lutheran participation with Faith Build during the March-June schedule?
  - Motion: During Lent proposed a special offering at the soup suppers.
    - Motion: Barb Kilpatrick. 2nd: Leslie Weirmeir. Approved
- O Discussion of proposal to pay a good faith payment to our substitute Pastors for the cancelled services on Friday, January 6th and Sunday January 8th.
  - Motion to pay Pastors George Kaufman and Jeff VanOsdol \$75. Motion: Al Weirmeir 2<sup>nd</sup> Leslie Weirmeir Approved.
- That Council directed the LCGS Treasurer to transfer \$1,500 from General Funds into the Designated Funds Account 135. Monies to be used for Camp Restore as discussed in last Voters meeting. Motion Al Weirmeir 2<sup>nd</sup> Leslie Weirmeir Approved

- o Discussion of the proposal to make the Church Secretary an employee of LCGS.
  - Motion:
    - Council recommends to the LCGS voters that Pam Reynolds be hired as a part-time employee of LCGS.
    - That she would continue working her current schedule of 4 hours a day
      - o Monday thru Friday, 10:00am to 2:00pm
    - That she would receive an hourly rate of \$14.24 per hour.
    - That she be authorized six (6) paid holidays (at 4 hours per holiday) a year:
      - o New Year's Day
      - o Memorial Day
      - o 4th of July
      - o Labor Day
      - o Thanksgiving Day
      - o Christmas Day
    - That she be authorized five (5) additional Paid Personal Days (at 4 hours a day) per calendar year.
      - o These Hours can be used as Sick days or Vacation.
    - Motion to approve Al Weirmeir 2<sup>nd</sup> Allen Summers Approved
  - Discussion of the following
    - Planning 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Reformation celebration.
