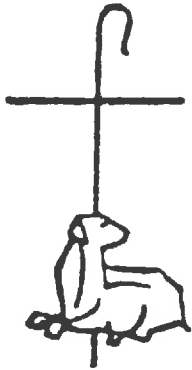

We have completed the first eight chapters and have found that Isaiah is easily speaking to us and our time as well as to Israel and Judah.

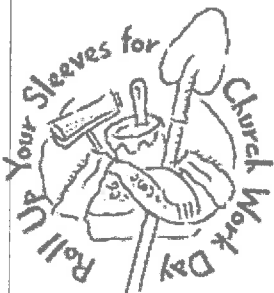
Come join us here at church in the fellowship hall each Wednesday morning 10-11:30 for coffee/tea and lively discussion in God's never changing Word.

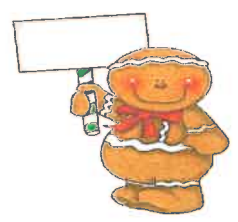

Some reminders of things that you already know, but tend to forget:

FLOWERS: Flowers may be donated to beautify the Sanctuary. To donate simply pick your date(s) and sign your name on the calendar on the bulletin board in the Narthex. If you want to honor someone, indicate that by your name. Kathy Washington orders the arrangements from Barrett's Florist. The cost for one arrangement is \$35.00 plus tax and the florist will send you the bill. Please send your payment to the florist. You may pick up your arrangement any time after the late service: Please leave the ceramic vases. Please do not remove flowers unless they are yours. Flowers not picked up by Thursday will be disposed of.

KITCHEN: If you use the kitchen, make sure you clean it up afterwards. Don't leave dirty dishes around. Make sure the coffee pots and hot water pot are unplugged and cleaned.

LIGHTS: If you are the last to leave a room, turn out the lights.
If you are closing up after a meeting, don't forget to check the restrooms for lights on.

PARKING: Remember to display your handicap placard whenever you park in one of the handicap parking spaces. Those spaces are reserved for members and guests that possess a valid placard.
