

Americans celebrates July 4 as Independence Day because it was on July 4, 1776, that members of the Second Continental Congress, meeting in Philadelphia, adopted the final draft of the Declaration of Independence.

Following its adoption, the Declaration was read to the public in various American cities. Whenever they heard it, patriots erupted in cheers and celebrations.

In 1777, Philadelphians remembered the 4th of July. Bells were rung, guns fired, candles lighted, and firecrackers set off.

When the war ended in 1783, July 4 became a holiday in some places. Speeches, military events, parades, and fireworks marked the day. In 1941, Congress declared July 4 a federal holiday.

Today the holiday is celebrated in many ways. Family gettogethers, bicycle decorating, floats, parades, bands, concerts, baseball games, watermelon-eating contests, and of course, picnics. Food-lots of food: hot dogs, hamburgers, potato salad

On behalf of the library, I would like to thank whomever made the generous donation to the LCGS Library. Many thanks, and God's blessings!


TWELVE EXTROORDINARY WOMEN JOHN MACARTHUR

GOOD NEWS! We have met our minimum and this trip is a GO! Printed brochures are available in the narthex. It's not too late to join us!


ALSO NOTE: Female roommate needed for a long-time friend of Jan Saxe.
